

**Alcohol Policy Implementation Committee
Meeting Notes
July 1, 2003**

Discussion

Lea Stewart reported on the first meeting of the Coordinating Committee comprised of representatives of the three campus alcohol committees who will meet together three times per year with Director of the Center for Alcohol Studies Dr. Rob Pandina.

The Committee had discussion concerning the collection of college and campus-based policies related to alcohol. It was decided that the Committee would attempt to collect and organize college-based policies to the extent they exist, including residential life and any other policies (e.g. campus center) related to alcohol. Individual committee members from the colleges will attempt to collect policies from their units and report back to the committee.

Brian Rose distributed draft copies of the Progress Report for the Committee and asked for any comments, corrections by July 17th.

The Committee elected to take up on its agenda for the Fall 2003 semester a review of the umbrella University alcohol policy given that it has not been updated for more than 20 years.

The Committee briefly discussed transportation options for students who have been drinking.

1. Further discussion of the call-a cab program was deferred until we receive updated information from Elizabeth O-Connell-Ganges.
2. Another option raised was to expand awareness of or scope of the Knight Mover service. One concern was that students at a party won't want to call police (who dispatch the Knight Mover). Drivers of the shuttle do not make reports to police as part of their duties, so there was some thought that better promotion and education of program might increase its use. What is capacity of service to grow?
3. Increase awareness of escort through security (7PM - 3AM). Two vans for Knight Mover. BC and Georgetown service -- is this a model for a fixed route bus system that would service major night-time spots?

Marketing: Refrigerator magnets. Joyce Sagee is looking into it. This was

recommendation from RHA. Make sure that numbers you provide will work with student phones in residence hall (so no confusion). Particular concern w / 911.

Drug Policy. We agreed to undertake one meeting in the Fall dedicated to a discussion of drug policy. A booklet on drugs was distributed. Concern is that there should be more consistency from college to college.

There is interest in training staff to recognize symptoms of drug use. Request of every college any written procedure on drugs that may exist for advance circulation.

The Committee set the tentative agenda for Fall meetings as follows:
